

#### **Colorectal Cancer**

March is Colorectal Cancer Awareness month. Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States. Every year, about 140,000 Americans get colorectal cancer, and more than 50,000 people die from it.

If you're 50 to 75 years old, get screened for colorectal cancer regularly. New guidelines from the American Cancer Society have lowered the recommended age to start screening. It is now recommended by the American Cancer Society that screening begin at age 45. Talk to your doctor about the age you should start screening. There are different types of tests for screening. Some screening tests can be done from the comfort of your home. Talk to your doctor about which screening test is right for you.


### **Heritage Moment**


Have you been reading up on the Heritage Moments?

This month features the **Honorable Curtistene Smith McCowan**, who made history by becoming the first woman to be elected mayor of DeSoto, Texas.Moreover, Mayor McCowan served on the Texas Southern University Board of Regents from October 2007 to May 2015. In addition, Soror McCowan also won a seat on the DeSoto ISD Board of Trustees in 1990 and served two three-year terms as a School Board Trustee, with two of those years as the President.



After more than 32 years of meritorious service, Mayor McCowan retired from the federal government in 2005. Described as a passionate advocate for quality education for all, Soror McCowan has made a significant impact to the advancement of education at the local, state and national levels.
