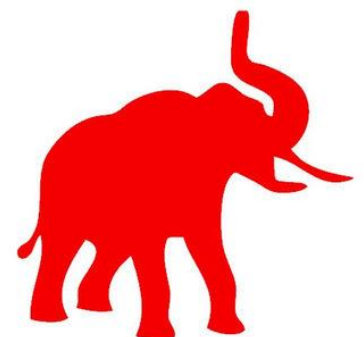

When asked what they can rely on most in 20 years, millennials' top choice is their savings accounts (66%). The majority of Gen Xers (71%), by contrast, said they count most on their 401(k)s. And boomers rely most on pensions (54%) and Social Security (50%).

The irony is that many Boomers and Gen Xers think of millennials as irresponsible. But millennials' financial habits suggest they may be the most

financially conservative group of all.

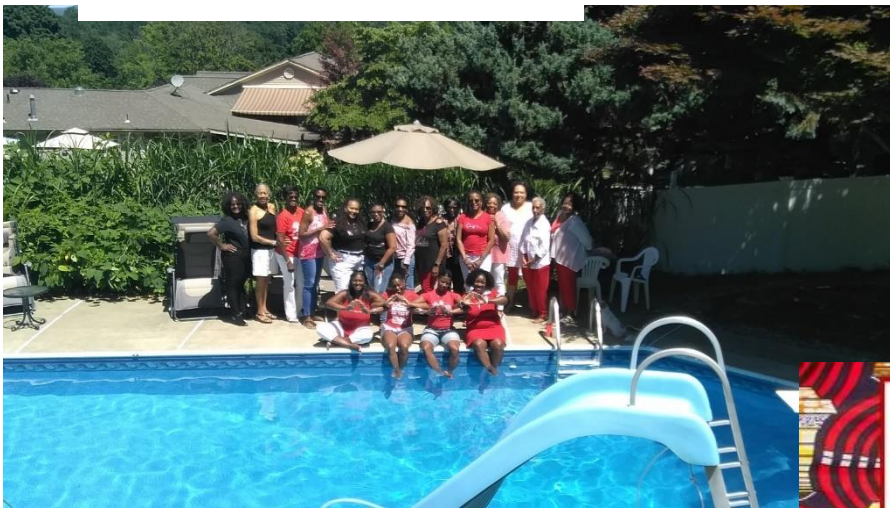
